3. Planning Study Summary — List the planning study title and briefly describe the project.

The Village of Lakemore and Springfield Township share a school system, Springfield Local Schools. The Village would like to improve connectivity between the residential neighborhoods and Springfield Jr/Sr High Schools by adding safe alternatives to the current travel modes. The "Spartan Trail Extension" study will help the Village to develop a plan for improving the undeveloped sections of the Spartan Trail in the Village in order to provide students and residents with a safe option for traveling to school. It will also look at adding bikeways and increasing accessibility to the existing Metro transit system and provide those students, who no longer receive school transportation due to lack of funds, a safer route to school than walking on Sanitarium Road.

- 4. Study Area & Map Please describe in detail the study area, including physical boundaries and limits. Include a map of the proposed project planning area, with limits of the study clearly visible. The areas of interest are marked as "future phase" and "phase 2". The Spartan Trail starts in Springfield Township on Waterloo Road and will end at the Springfield Bog Metro Park.
- 5. Purpose & Need (25 points)

The purpose of the "Spartan Trail Extension" study is to improve connectivity within the Village and Springfield Township. Providing a safe trail for students from both communities to reach their school, because they can no longer ride a school bus, is needed.

The areas where many of these students walk to school are along Canton Road and Sanitarium Roads. Walking on these roads are especially dangerous during winter months when roads are treacherous and there is little sunlight. A trail would remove the students from these dangerous roads.

The Village of Lakemore and Springfield Township are located southeast of Akron, surrounding Springfield Lake. Originally serving as vacation communities, the area was developed with narrow, meandering roads. These roads no longer accommodate for safe pedestrian travel. The lack of sidewalks also limits residents' access to Springfield High School and Junior High.

Springfield High School and Junior High are located at the Canton Road end of Sanitarium Road with the SUPER Learning Center at the other. Sanitarium Road has an average daily traffic of 4,650 vehicles. With over half of Sanitarium Road lacking sidewalks, this puts students and parents in close proximity to this high volume of traffic on a regular basis.

#### 6. Outcomes (15 points)

The expected outcome from this study is to create the best layout for the completion of the Spartan Trail and include all necessary safety precautions to provide for the students and residents.

This study will be a major boost to the safety of the Village's students and residents. The Village hopes to maintain a small-town atmosphere by allowing safer access to local places where they can exercise, take part in recreational activities and safely walk to schools and the commercial businesses in the community. This will have the additional benefit of reducing emissions, creating a cleaner, healthier community.

Success will look like students walking to and from school safe from interactions with vehicles. With a plan for "Spartan Trail Extension", success will look like two communities coming together as one.

### 7. Connecting Communities Principles (30 points)

Increasing alternative transportation options to connect people and places:

By completing the Spartan Trail, residents and students will be able to easily access schools, more of Springfield Lake as well as nearby businesses. Since the financial stability of Springfield Local Schools is under watch, transportation for students attending Springfield Sr. / Jr. High was eliminated. Students of Springfield Township and the Village of Lakemore need a safe way to reach school. This collaborative study will benefit both communities for school, work, and recreation. The trail was always meant to include

pedestrian and bicycle traffic, so this project also provides a healthy option of travel that is better for the environment.

Promote Complete Street principles to create vibrant and safe places for all users:

Being able to walk safely on the heavily traveled Sanitarium Road to get to Springfield Local schools will be a boon to the residents and school children.

#### 8. Level of Use (10 points)

The Village of Lakemore has approximately 3,100 residents. The improvements that can be accomplished with this study grant will benefit all of them. It will also allow school children and their parents to travel safely on the Spartan Trail to get to Springfield Local schools. Improving access will make it easier and safer to connect to and from school for two communities during a time when limited transportation could impact the education of our youth.
